

Russ is an award-winning multi-instrumentalist playing original music on traditional American instruments. He won first and second place on mountain and hammered dulcimer in the Deep South Dulcimer Contest in 2019 and has taught workshops at several festivals in Pennsylvania. In 1983, Russ stumbled upon the entrancing performance of Walt Michael at the Waterloo Bluegrass Festival in NJ, and from that moment, learning to play the hammered dulcimer became his passion. Inspired by Celtic and Old-time influences, his tune. "Planxty Fluharty," clinched first place in the Instrumental Category of the Mid-Atlantic Songwriting Contest. Shortly thereafter, he graced the stage of the Hard Rock Cafe in Washington DC, as the sole hammered dulcimer player, armed only with his

homemade instrument and heartfelt melodies. From the cobblestone streets of St. Augustine to the picturesque landscapes of Sedona, Russ has shared his passion for music with anyone willing to listen, weaving melodies that resonate with the soul and bring joy to those who pause to listen." Russ is entirely self-taught, and plays by picturing patterns which he then transposes onto the instrument. He has taught here at Pocono, at the Maidencreek Old Time Music Festival, and at the Greenwood Furnace Folk Gathering.
